Jonathan Willcocks founded Pinnacle Pursuits Inc. in 1997 – a Vancouver-based company which provides action-based group learning experiences that enhance individual potential and build effective teams.

Hundreds of B.C. school students, high-flying executives and their families and corporate leaders from around the world have got more in touch with their inner selves through programs designed by Pinnacle.

“I think we are products of two things,” said Willcocks, taking a moment to reflect on his life and accomplishments. “One, of our environment that we’re brought up with, and the other one is our choices based on who we think we want to be – whether we want to change our world, or whether we want to be bold and step forward, and be courageous to take new risks.”

Prior to founding Pinnacle, and three years into a degree program, he received a job opportunity as a boot camp wilderness instructor for young offenders. He subsequently came to lead at the Porteau Camp.

“That was a very, very positive working environment for me,” said Willcocks, who left the camp after seven years with a mission to continue that work with a broader subject base.
